

GENERAL SAFETY RULES

- 1. Keep your work area clean and well lit.Cluttered benches and dark greas invite accident

- A charger that may be suitable for one type of battery may create a risk of fire when used with another batteru.
- 5. Use battery operated tool only with specifically designated battery pack. Use of any other batteries may create a risk

- 6. Stayed alert, watch what you are doing, and use common sense when operating a power tool. Do not use tool while tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol, or medication. A moment of inattention while operating power tools may result in serious personal injury.
- 7. Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing, or have unprotected hair. Keep your hair, clothing, and gloves away from moving parts. Loose clothes, jewelry, or long hair can be caught in moving parts.
- 8. Avoid accidental starting. Be sure switch is in the locked or off position before inserting battery pack. Carrying tools with your finger on the switch or inserting the battery pack into a tool with the switch on invites accidents.
- 9. Remove adjusting keys or wrenches before turning the tool on. A wrench or a key that is left attached to a rotating part of the tool may result in personal injury.

- 13. Do not force tool. Use the correct tool for your application. The correct tool will do the job better and safer at the rate for which it is designed.
- 14. Do not use tool if switch does not turn it on or off. A tool that cannot be controlled with the switch is dangerous and must be repaired.
- 15. Disconnect battery pack from tool or place the switch in the locked or off position before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing the tool. Such preventive safetu measures reduce the risk of starting the tool accidentally.
- 16. Store idle tools out of reach of children and other untrained persons. Tools are dangerous in the hands of untrained users.
- 17. When battery pack is not in use, keep it awayfrom other metal objects like: paper clips, coins, keys, nails, screws, or other small metal objects that can make a connection from one terminal to another. Shorting the battery terminals together may cause sparks. burns, or a fire.
- 18. Maintain tools with care. Keep cutting tools sharp and clean. Properly maintained tools with sharp cutting edge are less likely to bind and are easier to control.
- 19. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts, and any other connection that may affect the tool's operation. If damaged, have the tool serviced before using. Many accidents are caused by poorly maintained tools.
- 20. Use only accessories that are recommended by the manufacturer for your model. Accessories that may be suitable for one tool may create a risk for injury when used on another tool.

- 1. Hold tool by insulated gripping surfaces when performing an operation where the cutting tool may contact hidden wiring. Contact with a "live" wire will also make exposed metal parts of the tool "live" and shock the operator.
- 2. Be aware that this tool is always in an **operating condition,** because it does not have to be plugged into an electrical outlet.
- 3. Always be sure you have a firm footing.
- 4. Be sure no one is below when using the tool in high locations.
- 5. Hold the tool firmly.
- 6. Keep hands away from rotating parts.
- 7. **Do not leave the tool running.** Operate the tool only when hand-held.
- 8. Do not touch the drill bit or the workpiece **immediately after operation.** they may be extremely hot and could burn your skin.

Tips for maintaining maximum ba ttery life

- Charge the battery before completely discharged. Always stop tool operation and charge the battery when you notice less tool
- 2. Never recharge a fully charged battery cartridge. Overcharging shorten the battery service life.
- 3. Charge the battery with room temperature 10 °C -40 °C (50 oF - 104 oF). Let a hot battery cool down before charging it.
- 4. Charge the Lithium-ion battery when you do not use it for more than six months.

FUNCTIONAL DESCRIPTION



- Battery cartridge

CAUTION: Always be sure that the tool switched off and the battery cartridge is removed before adjusting or checking function on the tool.

Installing or removing battery cartridge

Always switch off the tool before insertion or removal of the battery cartridge.

To remove the battery cartridge, withdraw it from the tool while pressing the buttons on both sides of the cartridge. To insert the battery cartridge, align the tongue on

the battery cartridge with the groove in the housing and slip it into place. Always insert it all the way until it locks in place with a little click. If not, it may accidentally fall out of the tool, causing injury to you or someone ground you.

Do not use force when inserting the battery cartridge. If the cartridge does not slide in easily, it is being inserted correctly.


1. Switch trigger

Switch action

CAUTION: Before inserting the battery cartridge into the tool, always check to see that the switch trigger actuates properly and returns to the "OFF" position when released.

To start the tool, simply pull the switch trigger. Tool speed is increased by increasing pressure on 1. Lamp the switch trigger.

Release the switch trigger to stop.



1. Reversing switch lever

This tool is equipped with an electric brake. If the tool consistently fails to quickly stop after switch trigger release, have tool serviced at a service

Reversing switch action

This tool has a reversing switch to change the direction of rotation. Depress the reversing switch lever from the R side for clockwise or from the L side for neutral position, the switch trigger cannot be pulled.

CAUTION: Always check the direction of rotation before operation.

Use the reversing switch only after the tool comes to a complete stop. Changing the direction of rotation of before the tool stops may damage the tool.

When not operating the tool, always set the reversing switch lever to the neutral position.

Lighting up the front lamp

CAUTION: Do not look in the light or see the source of light directly. Pull the switch trigger to light up the lamp. The lamp keeps on lighting while the switch trigger is being pulled.

Use a dru cloth to wipe the dirt off the lens of lamp. Be careful not to scratch the lens of lamp. or it may lower the illumination.

Adjusting the fastening torque

The fastening torque can be adjusted in 19 steps by turning the adjusting ring so that its graduations are aligned with the pointer on the tool body. The fastening torque is minimum when the number 1 is aligned with the pointer, and maximum venerating is aligned with the pointer. The clutch will slip at various torque levels when set at the number 1 to 18. The clutch is designed not to slip at the β marking.

Before actual operation, drive a trial screw into your material or a piece of duplicate material to determine which torque level is required for a particular application.

The adjusting ring does not lock when the pointer is positioned only halfway between the

Do not operate the tool with the adjusting ring set between the number 18 and the marking. The tool may be damaged.


Hold the ring and turn the sleeve counterclockwise to open the chuck jaws, place the bit in the chuck as far as it will go.




